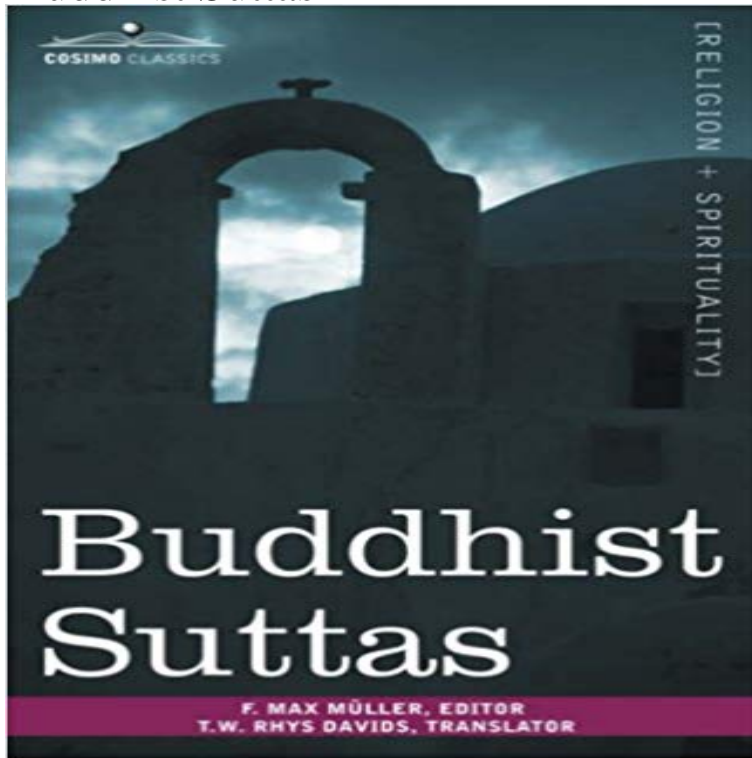


# Buddhist Suttas



Originally published in 1881, this translation of Buddhist texts introduces readers to the most important messages from the Buddha, including those discussing the Eighth Fold Path and the Four Noble Truths. Spiritual seekers, new Buddhists, and anyone interested in the philosophy of Buddhism will find these suttas an essential read. German author FRIEDRICH MAX MULLER (1823-1900) combined the studies of language, culture, and religion to create the discipline of comparative mythology. Among his many works are *India: What Can It Teach Us?* and *Wisdom of the Buddha: The Unabridged Dhammapada*.
