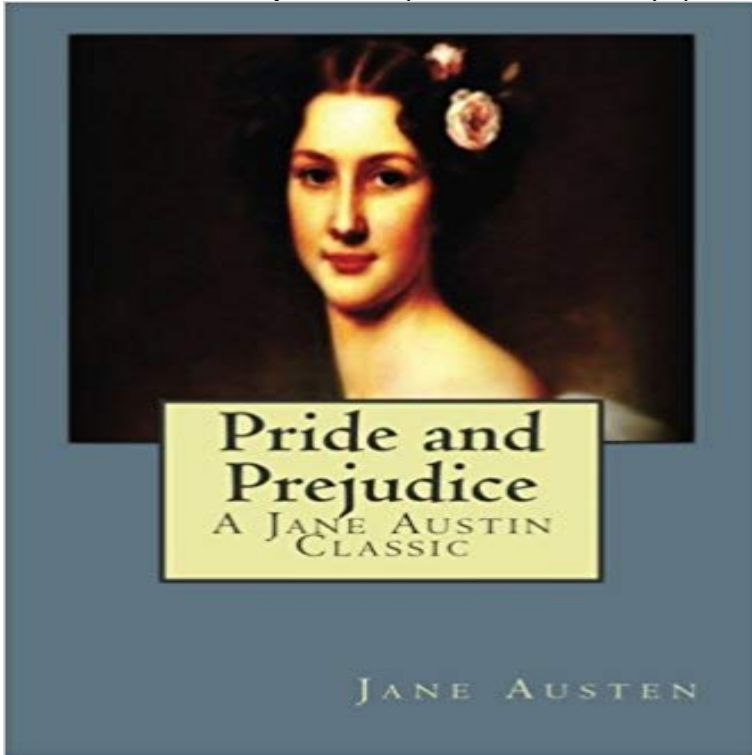


Pride and Prejudice (Jane Austen) (Volume 1)
