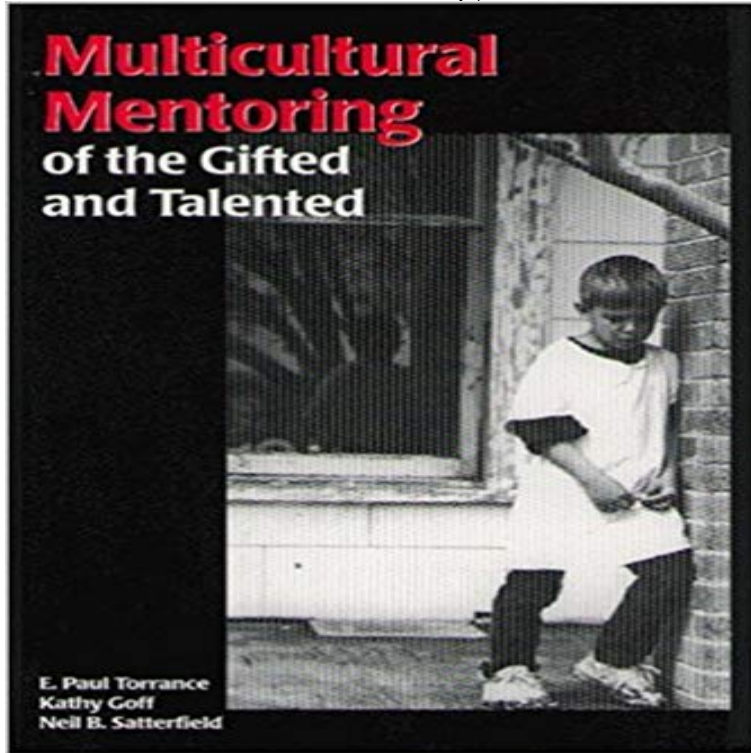


# Multicultural Mentoring of the Gifted and Talented
